

Tumbili Lodge, Arusha

DAY 2: Tarangire National Park and Lolkisale Luxury Camp



Tarangire National Park

Tarangire is one of my favourite parks and is the sixth largest park in the country with 2,850 square kilometres of wilderness.

Elephants, and other animals, are always confident of finding water in Tarangire and in the driest of seasons they will dig the river bed or visit the swamp, a sort of water tank for the region. In desperate times, the elephants will strip the bark from the Baobab trees that define Tarangire and squeeze out the water.





Top Guides Lolkisale Camp, Tarangire

Lolkisale Camp is situated right in the heart of Tarangire National Park, on the edge of an open wetland. Here, you'll have the unique experience of watching the drama of nature unfold while sipping a coffee or wine on your front porch. In these wetlands, the view changes each day as different herds pass by in search of water, and after them, the big cats that inevitably follow. Being so well situated within the park, your adventure begins at first light. There's no waiting at the gate to get in.

This beautiful boutique camp is composed of eight, custom-designed luxury safari tents with attention paid to every detail. Everything from the soothing colour palette, to locally-woven rugs, to the soft touch of your sheets at night, are selected to bring luxury and local flavour to this secluded corner of these beautiful surroundings.

The dining tent is large and airy, allowing space for you to hide away in a secluded corner with your loved one, or unite the whole group for a large family meal. In the lounge, you can plan your upcoming drives or share stories while enjoying a drink for the fully-stocked bar with carefully-chosen wines, along with a selection of local arabica coffee, freshly brewed tea, sparkling water and soft drinks.



DAY 3: Mto Wa Mbu and Manyara's Secret Lodge



Explore Mto Wa Mbu

As we leave Tarangire we will pass by the bustling town of Mto Wa Mbu which is a little micro hub for safari supplies and street food. We will take a break to amble around this fascinating town which is a hive of activity with safari-goers, guides and camp workers as they prepare for the adventure.

There is so much to explore in Mto Wa Mbu: youth art projects; the makonde wood carvers; you have the option of a banana plantation walk where you can enjoy a traditional family lunch and drink mbege, banana beer!

Your tour will finish in the bustling local market, where you can wander around stalls selling fruit and vegetables stalls, spices and meat. Your guide will stop and explain points of interest, and give you the opportunity to try and smell a variety of foods. A real treat for the senses!





Manyara's Secret Lodge

Manyara's Secret is an exclusive boutique lodge that overlooks Lake Manyara's National Park, a mere 15 minutes by car, and is close to Tarangire National Park, which is an hour's drive away, At the end of a wonderful day you can look forward to a delicious menu that is nothing short of delightful. Later you can relax in a bed of supreme luxury.

After dinner, you can sit together on your terrace or in your private plunge pool and unwind to the strange and magical sounds of Africa: the laugh of the hyena, the cry of an exotic night bird.

The two-person villa has been designed for you to enjoy Manyara's Secret in complete privacy. 


DAY 4: Transit via Ngorongoro Crater and Intimate Places Camp, Ndutu



Ngorongoro Crater View

The Ngorongoro Crater is the gateway to the Serengeti and we will stop at the view point to see the entire crater some 600 metres below. It is the world's largest caldera and hosts the highest concentration of wildlife in Africa.

This camp offers an authentic safari experience in comfort and style with outstanding food. For medium sized groups there is the option of an exclusive mobile camp.




DAY 5: Ndutu Southern Serengeti and Intimate Places Camp, Ndutu



Ndutu, Southern Serengeti

While Ndutu is an excellent game viewing area throughout the year, the best time to visit the Ndutu plains is from the end of December, when the Great Migration herds begin to arrive from the north, until April, when millions of wildebeest, gazelles, and zebras begin their journey northwards again. Due to the seasonal rains, massive herds of wildebeest and zebra can be seen all over these plains at this time of year.

Thousands of calves are born within Ndutu during the calving season, making Ndutu a home for new creatures on Earth. Giraffe, impala, elephant, dik dik, lion, cheetah, leopard, hyena, bat-eared fox, genet, jackal, wildcat, and many other animals end up living in Ndutu. The plains, marshes, and lakes to woodland attract an abundance of bird species.

You will return to the friendly welcome awaiting you at camp ready for sundowners, charmed by the sounds of nature in the wilderness.

DAY 6: Ndutu and Central Serengeti Game Drive and Intimate Places Camp, Serengeti



Ndutu, Southern Serengeti

The Ndutu plains is located in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, on the outskirts of the Southern Serengeti plains. These plains are enriched with tremendous acacia trees, providing a panoramic view across Lake Ndutu and Masek at the other end. It is one of the best places in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area to spot predators and enjoy the stunning landscapes. Standing here means you're in the midst of a calving ground for migratory wild animals, specifically the wildebeest migration. It is typically composed of vast swaths of short grassland, soda-lake Masek, marshes, and woodland vegetation that support both residents and migratory animals.

The big 5 are on everyone's list, and you're sure to see most if not all, but we might stumble upon an aardvark or the elusive leopard or even a serval or caracal cat. The beauty of the Serengeti is that you never know what you will find. there is always a surprise!





Intimate Places Serengeti Central

Intimate Camp Seronera is located at the heart of the world famous Serengeti National Park and its operational all year around. The perennial waters of the Sero River are a major draw for most of the animals to be found in the Serengeti National Park and these inhabit the area year-round thereby providing some of the best game viewing experiences to be found anywhere on the planet.

The camp incorporates both a lounge tent as well as a dining tent. The lounge tent is furnished with comfortable settees and armchairs complete with a selection of Coffee table books, board games, a writing bureau and wireless internet connectivity so as to ensure that your every need is catered for when you are not out enjoying game drives.



DAY 7: Central Serengeti and Intimate Places Camp, Serengeti



Serengeti Central Game Drive

Meaning 'endless plains' in the Maasai language, the Serengeti is undoubtedly one of the world's most celebrated wilderness areas.

The Central Serengeti also has high-density game-viewing at all times and is well-known for its large concentration of cats, so much so that until recently this area was set aside for scientific research into predators, especially cheetah.

The camp has views over the local acacia trees and out to the far-off hills. It is close to the Elerai River and the Maasai bomas. The dining area, where you will eat breakfast and dinner, is located in the main tent. The deck is the ideal location for watching the sun set over the far-off hills while sipping a cool sundowner. In the evening after dinner you can unwind at the fire pit area, where you can share all your safari tales and experiences or perhaps hear from some of the team.



DAY 9: Ngorongoro Crater Game Drive and Tumbili Lodge



Ngorongoro Crater Tour

The Ngorongoro Crater is the world's largest intact and unfilled volcanic caldera and the Ngorongoro Conservation Area's main tourists' attraction. It is the largest and most scenic crater in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, with a large concentration of wildlife. It is also one of Africa's Seven Natural Wonders due to its breathtaking natural features. The Ngorongoro Crater is known as a home to over 25,000 animals, including the big five; elephants, buffaloes, rhinos, lions and leopards.

Other animals found in this crater include hippos, hyenas, warthogs, zebras, elands, gazelles, wildebeests, just to name a few. This makes Ngorongoro Crater probably the best site in Tanzania to spot and watch the big five as well as other wild species more easily.

DAY 12: Stone Town and Spice Tour and Kena Beach Hotel



Zanzibar - Stone Town and Spice Tour (optional at additional cost)

The lush tropical forests and pristine beaches spread across what is officially called the semi-autonomous region of Zanzibar, made up of Unguja and Pemba islands. Latham Island, also called Fungu Kizimkazi, is very small and uninhabited. Mafia Island is home to about 46 thousand people and countless species of wild animals. Each island is surrounded by many smaller islands, most of them unsettled.

Like mainland Tanzania, Zanzibar is an important centre of Swahili culture, and at the same time the meeting point of several ethnic influences. Following the Portuguese who arrived here in 1498, the island was heavily shaped by the Arabs during the Omani rule until the 18th century. The British empire, another addition to this eclectic mix of cultures, was also an important turning point that brought relief with the abolition of slavery.

Besides slave trade, the island's strategic position also gave way to the rise of relevant commercial activity, and while the new era has brought the end of colonial conflicts (the region was granted independence in 1963), Zanzibar remains an important market for cloves, seaweed, and spices, all sold around the coral stone landmarks of Stone Town. For this reason, the Zanzibar Archipelago is also known as the Spice Islands.
