Days 2-3

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Tarangire is one of Tanzania's most underrated parks – and those who know it well would have it stay that way.

Named after the Tarangire River that winds through its heart, this is a park of extraordinary character. Ancient baobab trees, some thousands of years old, punctuate the landscape like sentinels – gnarled, vast and utterly timeless. In the dry season, their twisted silhouettes against an African sunset are among the most iconic images in Tanzania.

Between June and October, the Tarangire River becomes the only permanent water source for miles, drawing wildlife from across the surrounding ecosystem in concentrations that rival anywhere in East Africa. Elephant herds of remarkable size – sometimes numbering in the hundreds – gather along the riverbanks alongside lion, leopard, buffalo and an astonishing diversity of antelope.

Tarangire is also one of the finest birding destinations on the continent, with over 550 recorded species including the iconic ground hornbill and the rare ashy starling found almost nowhere else in the world.

Less visited than the Serengeti and Ngorongoro, Tarangire rewards the curious traveller with an atmosphere that feels genuinely off the beaten track – which, of course, is exactly where we prefer to be.

(Day 3) Today, we will have a full day in Tarangire National Park and your guide will take you away to far off locations in search of the wildlife, perhaps past Silale swamp, or Loklisale Hill, getting lost in the vast natural landscape as a safari should be, with a hot breakfast or lunch - the choice is yours.

Days 4-5

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

After a wholesome breakfast we will take a morning game drive before leaving the Tarangire elephants and baobabs behind us as we venture off to our next destination.



NGORONGORO CONSERVATION AREA

Ngorongoro Conservation incorporates a vast area including the iconic crater with the southern Serengeti region known as Ndutu. The Ngorongoro Conservation Area is far more than its famous crater. Stretching across a vast highland landscape of ancient volcanoes, sweeping grasslands and dense forest, it is one of the most historically significant areas on earth.



The road to the Serengeti climbs through montane forest before cresting the highland plateau to reveal one of the great views in Africa – endless plains rolling to the horizon beneath an enormous sky.



The region is extraordinary archaeologically. At Laetoli, 3.6 million year old hominid footprints preserved in volcanic ash represent the oldest evidence of upright human walking ever discovered. At Olduvai Gorge – the Cradle of Mankind – fossils and tools dating back nearly two million years have reshaped our understanding of human evolution entirely.



The black magnetic sands, formed from ancient volcanic deposits, are unlike anything found elsewhere in Tanzania – dark, glistening and quietly extraordinary underfoot.

And throughout, the Maasai move across the plains as they always have, their crimson shukas bright against the golden grass – a living connection to a way of life that predates the

modern world entirely.

To pass through is to travel through time.

(Day 5) Today, we will have a full day in Ngorongoro Conservation Area and your guide will take you to the crater caldera floor in search of the wildlife with a hot breakfast or lunch to enjoy at a picnic area.

NGORONGORO CRATER FLOOR

(Day 5)

Ngorongoro Crater – the Eighth Wonder of the World was formed around three million years ago when a massive volcano collapsed inward, the Ngorongoro Crater is the largest intact volcanic caldera on earth – a natural enclosure roughly 20 kilometres across and 600 metres deep, sheltering one of the most extraordinary concentrations of wildlife anywhere on the planet.

Approximately 25,000 large animals live permanently within the crater walls – lion, elephant, buffalo, hippo, hyena and the highest density of black rhino remaining in Tanzania. The crater floor is a complete, self-contained ecosystem of open grassland, acacia woodland, freshwater streams and the glittering expanse of Lake Magadi, seasonally pink with flamingo.

The views on descent alone are worth the journey. As your vehicle winds down the crater wall, the scale of what lies below slowly reveals itself – and it never fails to silence even the most well-travelled visitor.

Ngorongoro is also deeply significant culturally – the surrounding highlands are home to the Maasai, who have coexisted with this extraordinary landscape for centuries.

Camp Kipekee Ngorongoro

Camp Kipekee Ngorongoro is a unique experience of sleeping on the rim with the crater vista just through the trees in front of camp. Chilly evenings are warmed by the campfire and extra warm blankets and duvets on the bed.

Similarly, the location is far from the main sites and roads and delivers an authentic safari experience of solitude in the wild.

Spacious tents, verandahs and fine dining complete this unique way to experience the crater.

The proximity of the camp to the descent road ensures and early arrival to the crater floor where you will enjoy a few hours of exclusive access to the high density of wildlife for which the crater is famous for.

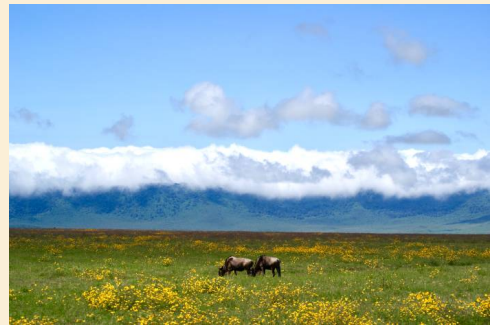

Days 6-7

NGORONGORO CONSERVATION AREA

Today is our last day in this dramatic region and after this day's exciting adventure we will leave Ngorongoro Conservation Area and head towards our next retreat.



NDUTU

Ndutu is where the story of the Great Migration begins its most tender chapter.

Located in the southern Serengeti and spilling into the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, the Ndutu region transforms between December and March as the short-grass plains explode into life following the rains. It is here that the great herds arrive to calve – over 400,000 wildebeest calves born within a matter of weeks in one of nature's most remarkable spectacles of renewal.



The calving season attracts every predator in the ecosystem. Lion prides, cheetah, hyena clans and wild dog all converge on the plains, drawn by an abundance that exists nowhere else on earth at this time of year. The interactions between predator and prey are relentless, raw and deeply compelling.



Beyond the Migration, Ndutu's shallow soda lakes attract vast flocks of flamingo and waterbirds, while the acacia woodland surrounding the lakes provides refuge for giraffe, zebra and a surprising density of leopard.



Ndutu is softer and more intimate than the northern Serengeti – a landscape of wide skies, golden grass and an extraordinary concentration of life that reminds you, at every turn, just how remarkable this ecosystem truly is.

(Day 7) Today, we will enjoy a full day to discover this incredible region's varied landscapes with hills, woodlands, lakes and plains. During the calving season the area is full of wildebeest and their young calves and predator activity is at its peak, an exciting truly off road experience before finding our way back to camp.



ACCOMMODATION

Camp Kipekee Ndutu

Few camps are built around a single moment. Camp Kipekee in Ndutu is one of them.



The camp offers great opportunities all year round but is the most secluded between April and December when the resident predators are highly active.



Between December and March, the short-grass plains of Ndutu host the calving season – over 400,000 wildebeest calves born within weeks of one another, drawing every major predator in the ecosystem to the southern Serengeti. Camp Ndutu positions you precisely where the action is.



Spacious and comfortable tents, outstanding food and warm, attentive service ensure that roughing it is never part of the equation. This is the southern Serengeti at its most extraordinary – experienced in comfort, in style and with the intimacy that only a small, well-positioned exclusive camp can offer.

Days 8-9

NDUTU

This day's sunrise in camp will announce our departure from this magical wilderness of lakes, woodlands and hills as we take our leave to our next base.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (SERONERA)

The name Serengeti comes from the Maasai word Siringet – meaning "the land that runs forever." Standing on the open plains, it is impossible to argue with that description.



Covering nearly 15,000 square kilometres, the Serengeti National Park is Tanzania's oldest and most celebrated park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most important wildlife ecosystems on earth. The sheer scale of it is humbling – an endless mosaic of open grassland, acacia woodland, rocky kopjes and seasonal rivers teeming with life at every turn.



At its heart lies the Central Seronera region, the year-round wildlife capital of the Serengeti. The Seronera River Valley attracts a permanent concentration of game that few areas anywhere in Africa can match – large lion prides that have roamed these plains for generations, leopards that drape themselves lazily across the sausage trees lining the riverbanks, and vast herds of elephant, buffalo and giraffe moving through the woodland.



Unlike the seasonal drama of the Migration, Seronera delivers exceptional game viewing every single month of the year. Whatever time you visit, the Serengeti will exceed your expectations.

(Day 9) Today, we will have a full day in the heart of the Serengeti around the Seronera river and your guide will take you in search of the wildlife, we will visit the hippo pool and look out for basking crocodiles. In addition to large lion populations, we may even find a leopard or two as this is Leopard capital country.

Days 10-11

SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (SERONERA)

After a hearty breakfast we will game drive our way through the iconic landscape of the Seronera Valley heading towards our next location.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (MARA)

There are wildlife spectacles. And then there is the Great Migration.

Between June and November, the northern Serengeti becomes the stage for one of the most extraordinary events on the planet. Over a million wildebeest, accompanied by hundreds of thousands of zebras and gazelles, follow their ancient instinct north in search of fresh grass and water.



The Mara River is where it gets dramatic.

The herds cross repeatedly, gathering nervously on the bank, edging closer until the pressure becomes irresistible. Then, in an explosive moment, they launch themselves into the churning water. Massive Nile crocodiles that have been lying in wait erupt into action. Raw nature at its most intense – and most humbling.



Our guides know this river. They read the herds, anticipate the crossings and – crucially – know how to position you away from the crowds that inevitably gather at the same well-known spots. Your experience is intimate, unhurried and real.



But the northern Serengeti is far more than the Migration. This is one of Tanzania's richest wildlife areas year-round – resident lion prides, leopards in the acacia woodland, vast elephant herds and the endless interaction of predator and

prey across open plains that seem to stretch forever.

(Day 11) Today, we will have a full day to search along the Mara River banks and landscapes for the great migration in addition to enjoying encounters with the resident wildlife before returning to the comfort of our campfire under the stars.

Camp Kipekee Serengeti will be located once we determine the migration pattern of the wildebeest and where we can be assured of some incredible sightings: whether it is the big cats in the kopjes, the migration in the western or eastern corridors or positioned beside the perennial waters of the Seronera River – one of the park's greatest magnets for wildlife and the reason this region delivers exceptional game viewing every single month of the year.

Days 12-13

SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (MARA)

Today after breakfast we will pack our cases and memories of this exciting adventure along the Mara River and head off to our next destination.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (LOBO)

Another beautiful and remote location awaits us that offers a fascinating contrast to the other locations: The Lobo region sits in the far northern reaches of the park, a landscape of dramatic granite kopjes, dense riverine woodland and sweeping golden plains that feels wilder and more remote than anywhere else in the Serengeti ecosystem. Few visitors reach it, and those who do are rarely in a hurry to leave.



The permanent waters of the Lobo Valley draw resident wildlife throughout the year, well known for its large lion prides that patrol extensive territories and possibly some special sightings of more elusive animals such as rhino, serval, caracal cats and leopards. It is an area of outstanding beauty and rich in bio-diversity as we transition from the endless plains of the Serengeti to this rugged and varied terrain.



(Day 13) Today, we will have a full day in Serengeti National Park (Lobo) and your guide will take you away to far off locations in search of the wildlife, lost in the vast natural landscape as a safari should be, with a hot breakfast or lunch - the choice is yours.

Camp Kipekee Lobo

Camp Kipekee Lobo will be east of the River Mara towards the famous Klein's gate.

The camp will be situated in a prime location, nestled in a woodland with a feeling of space and remoteness in the raw wilds of this region - famed for diversity of wildlife which no doubt will visit you in camp.

You will reunite with the camp team to provide you the same level of service and attention that you have become familiar with and it will be a pleasure for them as well as you to catch up around the campfire under the stars.

Days 14-15

SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK (LOBO)

After a hearty breakfast, we will take a morning game drive before leaving Serengeti National Park (Lobo) and venture off to our next destination.

LAKE NATRON

At the northern edge of Tanzania's Great Rift Valley, where the land fractures and the sky feels vast, lies one of the most extraordinary landscapes on the continent.

Lake Natron is not like other lakes. Fed by hot springs rich in sodium carbonate, its waters are among the most caustic on earth – hostile to almost all life, yet home to one of nature's most spectacular gatherings. Up to 2.5 million lesser flamingo breed on its burning shallow waters, drawn by the very inhospitability that keeps predators away. In the dry season the lake turns a deep, burning crimson as salt-loving microorganisms bloom – a colour so vivid it feels closer to another planet than another country.

The surrounding landscape is equally dramatic. Ol Doinyo Lengai – the Maasai's Mountain of God and one of the world's only active carbonatite volcanoes – rises sharply to the south, still venting gently against the sky. And on the lakeshore, preserved in volcanic ash for 19,000 years, ancient hominid footprints offer a silent connection to the earliest chapters of human history.

(Day 15) Today, we will have a full day in Lake Natron and your guide will take you away to far off locations in search of the wildlife, lost in the vast natural landscape as a safari should be, with a hot breakfast or lunch - the choice is yours.

Camp Kipekee Lake is a unique, ecological camp set in one of the most visually dramatic locations in the world! Home to the Maasai, abundant wildlife and over 1 million flamingos, our camp is perfectly situated for amazing adventures!

Lake Natron Camp is home to the hominid footprints, the largest breeding ground for Lesser Flamingo and in the shadow of Ol Doinyo Lengai, the only active volcano in the region and a demanding hike! It is truly an off the beaten track location to start or end a safari tour that includes the Serengeti and well worth it.

The Kipekee camp at Lake Natron will be the familiar crew from before and they will be excited to reunite with you and hear of your adventures around the campfire.

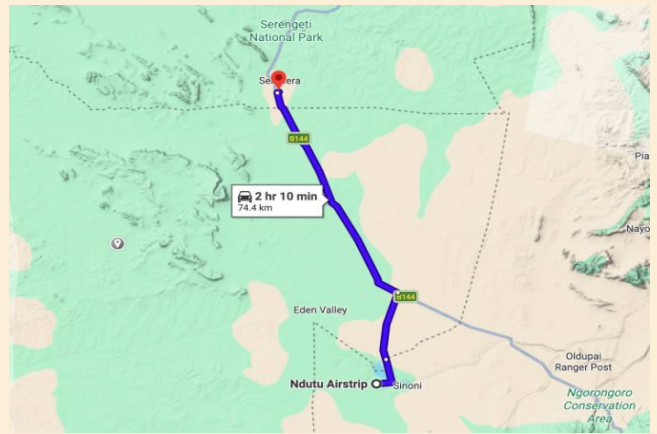

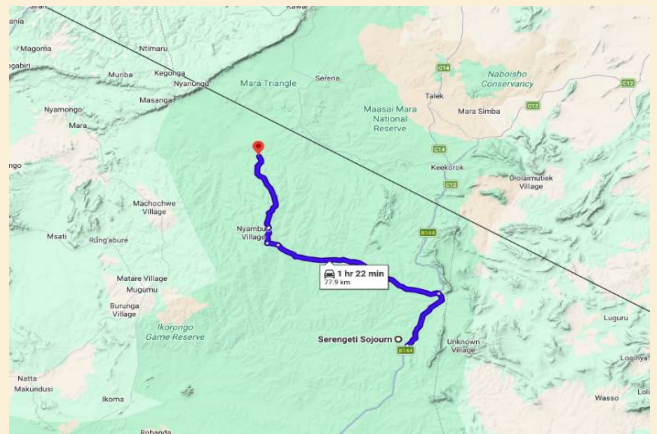
